NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING TO RECEIVE PUBLIC COMMENTS

PROPOSED DESIRED FUTURE CONDITIONS OF GROUNDWATER MANAGEMENT AREA 12

The Post Oak Savannah Groundwater Conservation District (District) will hold a **Public Hearing at 5:30 pm, September 15, 2026**, at the District's office at 310 E Ave. C, Milano, Texas, for the purpose of receiving public comments on the proposed Desired Future Conditions for the area aquifers that were adopted by Groundwater Management Area 12 (GMA 12) under §36.108, Texas Water Code on April 27, 2026.

GMA 12 includes the groundwater conservation districts as follows: Brazos Valley Groundwater Conservation District, Fayette County Groundwater Conservation District, Lost Pines Groundwater Conservation District, Mid-East Texas Groundwater Conservation District, and Post Oak Savannah Groundwater Conservation District.

The proposed Desired Future Conditions for the aquifers covered by GMA 12 for the District are expressed follows:

Brazos River Alluvium in Milam County- 5 feet of artesian decline averaged across the entire District through 2080

Brazos River Alluvium in Burleson County- 6 feet of artesian decline averaged across the entire District through 2080

Yegua-Jackson- 60 feet of artesian decline averaged across the entire District through 2080

Sparta- 46 feet of artesian decline averaged across the entire District through 2080

Queen City- 30 feet of artesian decline averaged across the entire District through 2080

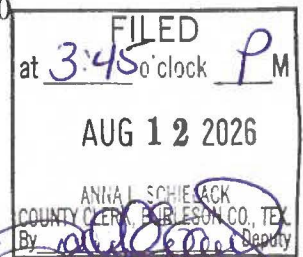
Carrizo- 146 feet of artesian decline averaged across the entire District through 2080

Calvert Bluff- 189 feet of artesian decline averaged across the entire District through 2080

Simsboro- 288 feet of artesian decline averaged across the entire District through 2080

Hooper- 190 feet of artesian decline averaged across the entire District through 2080
